# O'Growney National School Homework

#### Aims:

- To develop study skills and self-discipline in order to enhance learning.
- To encourage each child to become an independent learner.
- To promote consistency and a similar approach to homework across all classes
- To strengthen links and communication between home and school
- To challenge the child's ability and provide opportunities for creativity

#### Homework:

- ❖ Homework generally consolidates work which has already been done in class.
- The amount of time spent doing homework varies. The following are general guidelines only:

Junior / Senior Infants Up to 30 minutes

1st / 2nd Classes Up to 40 minutes

3rd / 4th Classes Up to 60 minutes

5th / 6th Classes Up to 90 minutes

- The time spent on homework will vary from day to day and also from the beginning to the end of the school year.
- All assigned homework should be written in the child's journal. This may be required to be signed by a parent/guardian each night.
- ❖ It is the child's responsibility to have his/her homework taken down each day.
- ❖ Parents are requested to check that it is neatly executed and fully completed.
- ❖ If for some reason homework cannot be completed, a signed note in the child's journal must be sent to the class teacher
- Normally, no homework is given at weekends.
- ❖ On occasions no homework is given, at the discretion of the class teacher.
- **\*** Children with learning difficulties will be given differentiated homework.
- Homework given will be corrected by the class teacher, self-corrected or in certain circumstances "peer" corrected.
- Continuous failure to do homework will lead to a "caution" or more serious "Continuous Misbehaviour sheet" being sent home.
- ❖ Written homework will not be given in the month of June.

#### Tables:

✓ All Classes from  $1^{st}$  -  $6^{th}$  will do tables as part of mental/oral maths.

## Spellings:

- ✓ Spellings are part of nightly homework from First to Sixth classes.
- ✓ Irish spellings are generally given each night as part of homework from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> classes.
- ✓ Weekly tests are given in Irish and English spellings.

### Guidelines for Parents/ Guardians:

- > Set aside a quiet regular time and proper conditions for doing homework. Make sure that electronic devices such as televisions, laptops, mobile phones, radios etc. are not part of the homework routine.
- Where possible, make sure that homework is completed as soon after school as possible.
- Encourage your child to keep copies neat and tidy and to complete work to the best of their ability.
- As your child gets older, he / she will work more independently. However, it is important that you are available for assistance with problems.
- > If your child has persistent problems or is unable to complete work for any reason, parents are asked to send a note in the homework journal to the class teacher.
- > The pupil's journal is an important record of the child's homework. It is also a valuable means of communication between parents and teachers.

## Programme of Wellbeing and Health Promotion

As part of our new initiative of promoting a healthy lifestyle and our wellbeing programme, physical exercise homework may be given to promote student health and wellbeing.

# Review and Monitoring:

This policy has been made available to school personnel and the Parents' Association and is readily accessible to parents on request.
